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
#### What is the Open Access Service?



### Mental Health Team

- MQI Mental Health Team currently has a Psychiatric Nurse and a Mental Health Case Worker
- We provide crisis mental health support, signposting and referrals to other Mental Health services, anxiety management, case management support and mindfulness groups







# A breakdown of Crisis Interventions

From January 2019 to date we have had **102** crisis interventions with **78** individuals

**18** individuals presented on more than one occasion





# Drug and Alcohol Use

Primary Drug Use	Number of individuals
Alcohol	14
Cannabis	3
Crack Cocaine	4
Heroin	26
Tablets (Benzodiazepines)	6
Snowball (Heroin & Crack)	1
Prescription Medication	5
Prescribed Methadone	4
Drug Free	8
